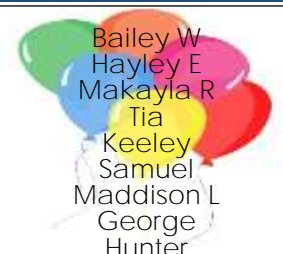

We have been developing our fine motor skills through a range of finger gym activities. Fine motor skills involve the use of the smaller muscles in your hands. They are used when writing and performing tasks like doing up buttons or cutting. In particular, we have been practicing using the muscles needed for a correct pencil grip to help improve our writing and drawing efficiency. The activities include picking up pom poms with tweezers, squeezing open a tennis ball, wrapping a stick, treading, and sorting beans with tweezers.
